(In ACT – natural – cultural (indigenous - non-indigenous) (Places and Objects)


Historic Value?

- event / phase / course of history
- rare or characteristic
- creative or technical achievement (can be architectural)

(see ACT Criteria a, b, d, f)


Historic Value?


Scientific (Research) Value?







How Heritage is Registered - ACT

3 STEPS

Nomination

Request more Info

Acceptance

Reject

(frivolous / rejected previously etc)

Provisional Registration

after Council formal assessment

Consultation: ad in newspaper, contact with interested parties, eg owner

(within 15 days)

(Consultation period for individual place 5 months)

Registration

after reporting to Minister, eg about results of consultation etc

(registration within 5 days of decision)


Social Value in the ACT –

Criterion g has a strong or special association with the ACT community or a cultural group within the ACT for social, cultural or spiritual reasons

trend in Australia since 2004 to 'levels' of significance
World Heritage, National, State/Territory and Local

Deemed must be 'Territory level':

The ACT community encompasses the broad community of the ACT, across the full geographical context, and a broad spectrum of society.



A cultural group: 'a group of people within a society with a shared ethnic or cultural background' or 'a group of people connected through the same way of living, which has been transmitted from one generation to another'.

ACT Heritage Council Heritage Assessment Policy March 2018
